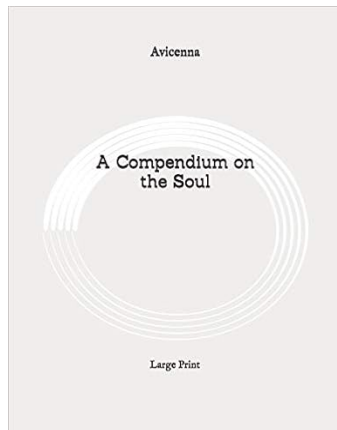

**Beschreibung:**

The soul completes the action of intellection by accepting forms that have been abstracted from matter.
